

We spend a lot of time indoors in the wintertime, which puts the focus on our interiors more than ever. Whether we're hosting over the

holidays, or just want to cosy up in comfort, a beautiful and organised home does a lot to help us feel good, however cold it may be outside. We spoke to stylist Melissa Denham about the key trends this winter.

Chocoholic design

"Chocolate was a colour trend first being talked about at the start of 2022, but this winter is really the season where we first start to see it come to life,' Melissa says. 'People are realising that grey isn't the only neutral to ground a space. Brown works surprisingly well with pretty much every colour out there. Layer it with neutral tones of cream and taupe. Pair it with pastel pinks, soft sage green and blush tones for a sophisticated edge. It also works with a moody palette of lush emerald green, cobalt blue, ochre and claret."

Return to the 1970s

"An unexpected trend coming through is a seventies revival, although the 2020s take is more restrained and curated, cherry-picking 1970s highlights while ditching the dated

aspects. It includes an eclectic mix of textures and patterns, such as animal prints, shag-pile rugs, velvet furnishings, geometric shapes, and soft curved edges. Designers embodying this style include Paloma Faith Home, House of Hackney, Bert & May x Livingetc collection, and Divine Savages."



Natural connection

"The after-effects of the pandemic are still being felt, and after our period of isolation, we have a longing to be close to nature. There is also a biophilic element to 1970s decor that is part of its appeal today - a lean towards natural materials such as rattan and cork, handcrafted ceramics, and macramé wall hangings. Not to mention a houseplant or two! Colours that make us feel warm, secure, safe and have that link to nature are ones that we want to surround ourselves with."


The fifth dimension

"Just like the four walls around it, a ceiling can do a lot to transform a

room. Considered the "fifth wall" by interior designers, ceilings shouldn't just be an afterthought. Paint your ceiling the same colour as your walls to create a cocooning effect, something we all crave in winter months. Or you can treat the ceiling as a blank wall in its own right, and paint it a contrasting colour. Paint effects and wallpapered ceilings are also becoming more popular."

Soft touch

"Winter always make us want to cosy up, so fabrics that have that a soft, warm feeling will always be popular in the colder months - think velvet, chenille and wool. Textured bouclé fabric has become popular for upholstery. However, the ubercool designer Abigail Ahern has just included a bouclé for curtains and Roman blinds in her second collection for Hillarys; something I haven't seen before. We are also seeing "teddy bear" fabric starting to appear. This is a softer version of bouclé, which is not as hardwearing, but is perfect for throws and cushions in those cold winter months snuggled up by the fire!"■




Why is organisation important to you?

Festive wreaths are a fantastic way to celebrate the season and add a touch of flair and colour to your neighbourhood. Let your creativity go wild and show your friends and neighbours what you stand for. Are you a traditionalist or do you prefer a contemporary moment? Do you love a good bauble or a whole host of natural ingredients? Whatever your style, express it outwardly and give all that pass your door a smile! When hanging your wreath, command hooks are your new best friend. They leave no mark and can easily be removed at the end of the season.

Tip: We all enjoy a little drink during the festive season and your wreath is no exception. Give your festive outdoor wreath a gentle spritz of fresh water once or twice a week to keep it looking fresh during the holiday season.

Create a flexible floral display for your dining table. Using multiple vases on your dining table will allow you to flex your display, depending on the number of guests and the food you are serving. The curated shelf

Top tips on styling your open shelves to perfection - from selecting the best pieces to display, to techniques for layering your treasures. Open shelves are a wonderful addition to living spaces - they give you the space to display your treasures and add interest to your room. Cleverly arranged open shelving works well in any room; an easy-to-reach spot for kitchen essentials, a beautifully organised bookshelf in a snug or a considered display of décor pieces, to tie together your living room.

While often concealed storage is the priority, open shelving can effortlessly break up a furniture-heavy space and breathe life and character into a home. We've pulled together five tips for making sure your shelves are styled to perfection, no matter what room they're in.

1. Cleverly curated

It's easy to get carried away with lots of trinkets, but more is not always better. A carefully curated shelf is more eye-catching and feels more 'style' than 'clutter'. The perfect styling doesn't necessarily happen overnight - pick out some of your most-loved treasures to start and gradually add to it over time. Antique shops and flea markets are full of gems that don't cost the earth, and pieces thoughtfully purchased while travelling add a personal touch.

2. Consider your scheme

Items like ceramics, candles, baskets, sculptures and art are brilliant go-tos when it comes to shelf styling, but

The items you choose to display will vary depending on the room - from kitchen crockery to bathroom bits and bobs - but sticking to these five general styling tips will ensure your shelves always look picture perfect.



for a well-rounded space it's best to ensure they fit seamlessly with your scheme. If your interior is a neutral haven, adding a random pop of colour on your shelf may look distracting and out of place. Think about every piece you add and consider whether it really works with your desired scheme and style. Tip: if there's a scented candle you love that doesn't match your colour palette, try to find a hurricane vase that works and hide your candle inside.

3. Layer textures

Keep things interesting by layering textures; woven baskets and raw ceramics add a natural touch, whilst framed art creates a personal, homely look. Books are another great way to add new texture and varied height to your shelves. Create a few different arrangements for a fluid look. On one shelf place a few books standing vertically, capped with a bookend. On another try a horizontal stack, topped with a vase. Second-hand bookshops are a great place to find key pieces and give them a new lease of life.

4. Create balance

Avoid your shelves looking like an overstocked shop shelf by creating balance throughout - spreading out colour and texture will make it more appealing to the eye. If you have a mainly neutral collection with just a hint of green accents, spread out the pops of colour across the shelves



so they are not condensed into one focal area. Rather than sporadically spreading items out, try placing them in sets of three or five for a considered and balanced aesthetic.

5. Change it up

It's important to remember that your style and possessions will evolve over time - the great thing with open

shelves is that they can evolve with you. As the years go by and your collection of treasures grows, you can easily switch out your styling to incorporate new things and create a different look. A shelf restyle is a great way to bring fresh life into your home and ensure you're constantly living in a space that brings you joy. ■

A guide to laid-back hosting

THE NEW WAY TO ENTERTAIN

In recent years many people have begun taking a calmer approach to life - embracing the now and finding joy in the little things. From flexible working to comfort-first fashion choices, the current and upcoming trends all lead back to prioritising health and wellbeing. Life is for enjoying - every wonderful thing and moment.

Socialising isn't any different, with a more laid-back approach to the pristine dinner parties that were once all the rage. Now a dinner party is a relaxed home setting, with simple and hearty home-cooked food served on perfectly mismatched tableware and laughter amongst loved ones filling the air; a beautifully wholesome scene.

With the season of entertaining firmly here, it's time to light the candles, preheat the oven and pull out your comfiest clothes, for wonderful nights spent around the dinner table. We've pulled together three cosy recipes that are perfect for a laid-back dinner party with your nearest and dearest.

COCKTAIL

Dark rum egg nog

Egg nog is one of the most indulgently decadent and delicious of all traditional festive drinks. The addition at the end of whipped-up egg whites is what gives this its wonderful light frothiness.

Serves 4

Ingredients

Eggs 2

Caster sugar 80g

Chilled single cream 200ml

Chilled whole milk 200ml

Dark rum 200ml

Orange cocktail bitters 8 dashes

Star anise 4 whole or

Thyme 4 sprigs

Nutmeg for grating

Method

Separate the egg whites and the yolks into two clean large mixing bowls.

Divide the sugar evenly between the bowls.

Whisk the yolks and sugar until thick; then whisk into that the cream, milk and dark rum.

Add the dashes of orange bitters. Transfer to a serving bowl.

Now for the egg whites. Whisk them with the sugar until they form meringue-like stiff



peaks, then gently but thoroughly fold the stiff whites into the bowl containing the cream and rum, etc.

Ladle into glasses, finishing each one with a grating of fresh nutmeg and a star anise or thyme sprig.

> Don't worry about the perfect glassware; add character to your cocktails and utilise all of your mismatched pieces!



APPETISER

Mussels in lemongrass, galangal and turmeric broth

British mussels are especially delicious when cooked in this aromatic broth, thickened by breadcrumbs, which also give some lovely flavour, contrast and crunch.

Serves 6

Ingredients

Mussels 1kg

Banana shallot 1

Ghee or rapeseed oil 2tbsp

Lemongrass 1 stalk

Garlic 2 cloves

Turmeric root 5cm piece

Galangal 5cm piece

Coriander 50g

Coconut milk 400ml tin

Panko breadcrumbs 30g

Chili flakes ¹/₄tsp

Method

Peel and finely chop the shallot. Heat 1 tablespoon of the ghee or oil in a wide pan over a medium heat. Add the shallot and cook for 5 minutes or so until just softening.

Finely chop the lemongrass and the peeled garlic. Add to the shallot, stir



for a couple of minutes, then grate in the turmeric root and galangal and add the finely chopped coriander stalks (be sure to save the leaves for later). Stir for a minute until softened.

Pour in the coconut milk, add some salt, and let it simmer gently for a few minutes.

Increase the heat and add the mussels. Put the lid on the pan and let them cook, undisturbed, for 4 minutes.

Add the panko breadcrumbs and chili flakes to the heated remaining ghee or oil in a small frying pan - toss around until nicely golden.

Take the lid off the pan of mussels

and you should see them excitingly opening. If some are still closed, replace the lid and cook for another 2 minutes, then remove from the heat and discard any that have remained closed.

Scatter half of the coriander leaves

over the mussels and broth and stir the rest through the crisped chilli breadcrumbs before scattering over the top of the mussels and broth, and serve straight away.

DESSERT

Chocolate olive oil cake with figs and hazelnuts

This is a pleasingly elegant cake to serve as a dessert. It's not overly rich, and has a lovely tangy bite from the yoghurt topping, with hazelnuts giving crunch as well as flavour.

Serves 10

Ingredients

Mild olive oil 150ml Carob flour or cocoa powder 60g Hazelnut liqueur 2tsp Golden caster sugar 200g Large eggs 3 Self raising flour 125g Fine salt pinch Greek yoghurt 200g Ripe figs 2

Skinned, toasted hazelnuts 100g

Method

Preheat the oven to 190C fan. Grease the sides of the cake tin with a little of the oil, and line its base with baking paper.

Sift the carob flour or cocoa powder into a bowl, then whisk in 125ml boiling water and the hazelnut liqueur. Set aside.

Put the sugar, the rest of the olive oil and the eggs into a large mixing bowl.



Use an electric whisk to beat them together until thickened: you are trying to get lots of air into the mix.

Beat in the carob flour/cocoa powder mixture, then sift in the flour and salt.

Gently but thoroughly fold the flour in, then pour the mixture into your prepared cake tin.

Bake for 35-40 minutes until just about set. Remove from the oven, cool on a wire rack for 10 minutes, then remove from the tin and leave to cool some more.

Once the cake is cool, spoon the thick yoghurt on top. Top with sliced figs and a scattering of hazelnuts.


