The Hedgehog Sanctuary



WE VISITED ALISON AND ANDY WHITFIELD, A KIND-HEARTED COUPLE WHO LOVINGLY SET UP A CHARITABLE GROUP CALLED 'LEICESTER HEDGEHOGS'.

Leicester Hedgehogs is a sanctuary for the rehabilitation of rescued, sick and injured hedgehogs at their family home. We wanted to find out more about the charity's work with the little hogs (as Alison likes to call them) and give the group some much needed exposure.

What initially sparked your interest in rescuing and helping hedgehogs?

Alison: "It all started in June 2016 as a slug eating solution for the garden. I found out that hedgehogs love slugs, so I contacted Leicestershire Hedgehog Rescue and asked >>



the question about keeping a hedgehog. They mentioned about keeping a disabled hedgehog as my garden is secured off by a fence, and then it just went from there. I completed my hedgehog first aid course with the Leicestershire Hedgehog Rescue, and so far we've nurtured back to health 17 hogs, that have successfully been released back into the wild this year.

Today, we have two permanent residents, both

fully grown and disabled hogs which live in our garden as they would likely not survive in the wild.

We have 7 hogs indoors being treated at the moment. All of them apart from two will go back to the wild. We try to release them back to where they were found unless the site isn't appropriate."

How do you find the time to manage the sanctuary and have a full time job?

Alison: "We just make time.

We work it around our jobs, in the mornings and evenings. It's really rewarding caring for them, especially when they respond to treatment well. It's a privilege to help them along the way."

What kind of illnesses can affect the hedgehogs which you nurse back to health?

Alison: "They can contract lungworm, ringworm, tapeworm, and bites that can cause infections.

Unfortunately hogs are prone

to so many things because they are omnivorous. They can eat anything from small mammals to frogs and anything could be infected with something. Some of them can go up and down in health, which can get frustrating as you can't figure out what the problem might be. We're forever sticking poo samples under the microscope to try and work out the causes!"

Do you get much support?

Alison: "As we're not a registered charity, the majority of this is completely self-funded, from the food to the medicines. A bottle of antibiotic costs £58 so it can be hard. Luckily we do get some donations from time to

time including blankets and extra food which is a massive help."

How can people look after hedgehogs in their community?

Alison: "One of the main things to do is to let the hogs move around. If you have a fence, you could put a little hole in at the bottom for them to move through, especially if your house backs out onto a field. You can leave out dog food, cat food, anything with meat. Fresh water in low level pots are perfect as they drink lots from eating slugs and snails, which are very salty. Also when it comes to clearing out the leaves in the garden during November and

December, keep a watchful eye as there may be a hibernating hedgehog nestled in there."

Do you see the Sanctuary growing?

Alison: "Probably not, largely because of the cost but also because of the time. My husband and I both work full time so our daily routine includes getting up at 5:00 in the morning, walking the dog then mucking the hedgehogs out. I am able to come back at lunchtime and get all the babies fed; if there are any medicines that are required I administer those. Then we feed them again in the evening, so it is a busy day but worth it to help out the hedgehogs."

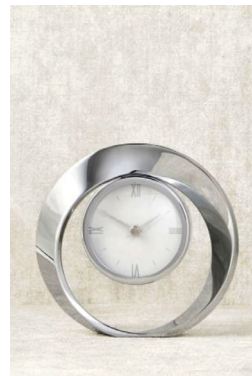

The Autumn Dinner Party Centrepiece

NOW IS THE TIME TO ADD SOME SEASONAL
FLAIR TO YOUR DINNER TABLE.

Preparation is everything if you're looking to wow dinner party guests. It can be fun to adorn a dinner table with a seasonal nod or an all-out show stopping centrepiece, dependent on your time and style. >>

TOP TIPS TO CREATING A SHOWSTOPPING CENTREPIECE THIS AUTUMN

- Give your centrepiece some height, but not too high that you can't see guests over the table. Two levels are great, which gives a cascading effect.
- A tray with sides and a wire fruit bowl has been used in this display. It gives the illusion of overflowing, which can then trail out around the spaces on the table with smaller decor, like small dried pumpkins.
- Add a little bit of nature, whether that be wheat from this year's harvest or acorns collected on an autumn walk.
- Etsy and Pinterest are great for ideas and purchasing unique decor from handmade suppliers. There are many great benefits when shopping with small businesses, one being you're supporting the growth of handmade sellers and also you probably won't find anything like it on the high street, which will really wow your guests.
- Add some seasonal flair to your napkin rings. There's no need to purchase new, just add a unique statement to the ones you already have with a piece of wheat or autumn leaf.
- Set the mood with enough candle light. Autumn equals cosy and candle light fills any room with a sense of warmth and intimacy, instantly.







Pumpkin & Tomato Soup

WE LOVE THIS HEARTY SOUP RECIPE WITH SEASONAL INGREDIENTS. IT'S PERFECT FOR WARMING UP ON A CHILLY AUTUMNAL DAY, AND EASY TO MAKE AT HOME.

Ingredients:

1kg pumpkin
1 ½ litres chicken stock
120 ml tomato puree
1 onion
2 teaspoons crushed garlic
2 teaspoons ginger, grated or finely chopped
2 teaspoons basil
Single cream
Croutons of choice

Directions:

- Carefully peel and chop the pumpkin into cubes.
- Add the pumpkin cubes into a large pot with the other ingredients apart from the black pepper.
- Bring the soup to the boil and simmer for approximately 30 minutes or until the pumpkin is tender. Remove from the heat.
- Place the soup in a blender or food processor and puree until you have a smooth consistency. Spoon cream over and grind some black pepper on top. Serve with croutons of your choice to add a crunch to your smooth, warming soup.



A Chat With The Chairman

WE SAT DOWN WITH CHAIRMAN RICHARD HAMMONDS, TO FIND OUT A LITTLE MORE ABOUT THE HISTORY OF THE COMPANY AND WHERE IT'S HEADING IN THE FUTURE.

Can you tell me a little history about how the company was founded?

Well, it was founded by my grandfather Thomas, who was a skilled cabinet maker. He received requests to make all manner of things, from coal scuttles to speaker



boxes, which is how it started. During the 1950's my grandmother Francis joined and that's where the name T&F Hammonds started, with a store based in Nuneaton. My grandfather's workshop was in the back and my grandmother sold homewares in the front. This then progressed to DIY, and from there it grew and developed.

When were you first introduced to the company?

I can remember when I was 9, attending an exhibition

and seeing the family name on the stand. It filled me with a great deal of pride which I have carried ever since.

Just over twelve months ago Hammonds went through an exciting new rebrand, how do you feel the aesthetic change has benefitted the company?

We felt that our furniture designs were evolving and moving forward so well, but our branding was being left slightly behind. I felt that we were beginning to lose our way a little with our message. It didn't feel like the Hammonds I knew. I wanted to make sure people understood who we really are - a British company, where we build all of our furniture ourselves in the factory



based in Leicestershire. I wanted this to be reflected

in the look and feel of the showrooms with the new branding.

I hope that we've achieved that goal, so far it has been very well received in the showrooms that have been rejuvenated. I'm very excited about rolling it out to all our showrooms in the near future.

As a company, we are very pleased to have a high trustpilot score of 8.7. Do you feel proud of your staff in each department for their hard work towards this goal?

Ultimately a business is made up of lots of people, and I'm very proud of every staff member. We wouldn't be able to do what we do without a great team of people, whether that's a demonstrator in a showroom, a designer visiting a customer's home; or the men and women in our factory making the product. All are imperative to making sure the company runs smoothly. We need all our staff to support the brand and everyone of

them contributes in some way to the customer's experience.

The company's latest venture over the last year has been the introduction of Hammonds kitchens within the Midlands and East Anglia. Can you tell us more about this new area of the business?

Kitchens are a natural progression for us. It's an installed product and we believe we have created a slightly different look and feel to what is currently on the market. We want people to understand they can have a beautiful looking kitchen without spending a fortune. Where do I see it going? Well, for me it's the next big



thing for us. I see this market as a great opportunity for Hammonds, so watch this space.

You always like to stay ahead of the game when it comes to home décor trends, can you tell us what inspires you personally?

I love home, I love architecture, I love it all! I find shop fittings fascinating, I get told off regularly when myself and my wife are

out shopping because I'm not looking at the items, but instead thinking about the way it has all been put together and presented in the store. I love design; I actually started my career in the business as a designer, so I suppose that's where it all stems from.

Are there any new product releases in the pipeline. If so, could you give us a teaser to what it will be like?

Yes, there are some new product launches on the way. One of them is what I'd call a home comforts design with a contemporary edge. The other, I would describe as new classic; which has a traditional feel but is modern for today's market.

What is your favourite thing to do in autumn?

We live in an area surrounded by lots of relatively new woodland, which has changed the environment wonderfully. I love walking the dog in autumn as the leaves are changing colour.

Do you have a favourite recipe for autumn?

I love Jamie Oliver's books. I'm not a great recipe follower which is probably why I enjoy his, because you don't have to be too precious about sticking to the instructions. They are simple to put together with great flavours. There is a dish that I love to cook, which is a basic sausage and tomato sauce recipe with mashed potato. It's simple to do, just chuck it in the oven and an hour later it comes out tasting delicious. That's my type cooking!

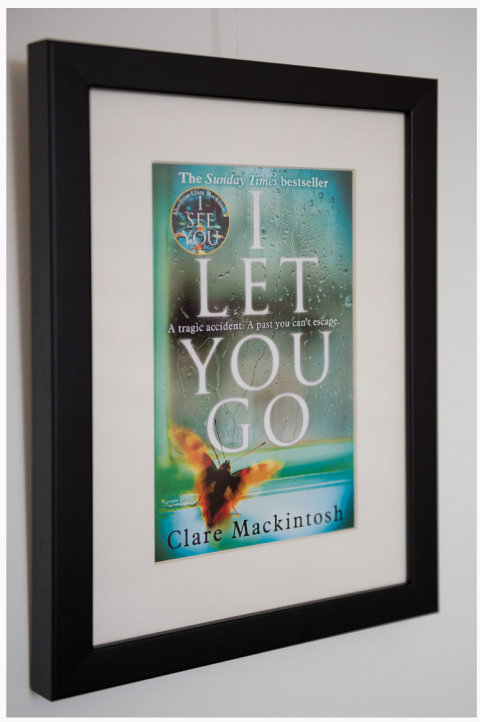

A CITY STEEPED IN HISTORY
WITH SCENIC SURROUNDINGS

You'll be stuck to fit everything in while visiting the Cathedral City of Peterborough. A place steeped in a vast amount of history and brilliant surrounding attractions. With so

much to see and do, you'll want to start the day with a great breakfast. Try Bill's or Cote Brasserie located in Cathedral Square, they also serve lunch and dinner, but with a wide >>

selection on their breakfast menus we recommend starting here.

Once you are fuelled up for the day, head straight on over to Peterborough Cathedral. The architecture is breathtaking, standing tall overlooking the city centre at 44m in height. The history of the site dates all the way back to 655 AD. It's hand painted ceiling is certainly a highlight and as entry is free; a great first attraction of the day.

If discovering all about the fascinating history of the city keeps you captivated, head on over to Peterborough museum, just a short walk away from the Cathedral. Discover the exhibitions of two local Bronze Age archaeological

sites and an amazing collection of work made by Napoleonic prisoners of war who had been held captive in the city. Ghost walks are held here every Halloween. Legend has it the museum is the most haunted building in the city.

A short drive from Peterborough town centre and you will arrive at some really scenic attractions. We recommend Ferry Meadows Country Park, a lovely location with a huge lake, perfect for a long walk or a bike ride with the family. There are lots of play areas for the kids to clamber on and cafés to grab a spot of lunch.

A short drive away from the Country Park is Longthorpe tower. A medieval tower with amazing,



ancient paintings displayed on the walls. Ensure you speak to the guide to bring the visit to life, giving a more detailed explanation about the history of the building and the paintings.

There are many excellent eateries in the city of Peterborough for a scrumptious dinner. Prevost boasts exceptional fine dining without the Michelin star price tag. If you're looking for something a little more relaxed, try Salamis Taverna or The Bee Hive. For evening entertainment, why not catch a show at a local theatre. Peterborough has lots to choose from including Key Theatre, The Cresset and John Clare Theatre.

Why not extend your visit into a long weekend; venture a little further to see more hidden gems just situated outside of Peterborough. Sacrewell Farm, Elton Hall and Gardens and The Exotic Pet Refuge are all great attractions to explore on your trip away.

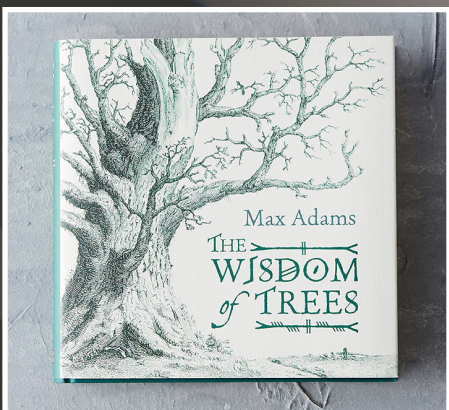
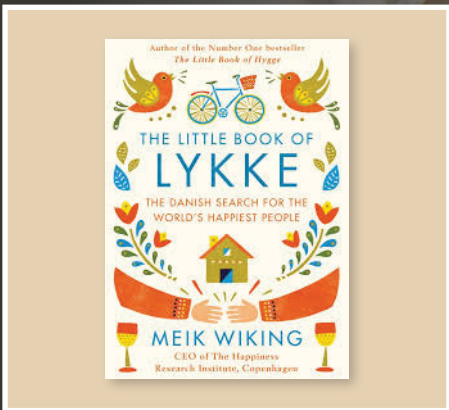
