Make your own Christmas handwarmers

THESE SIMPLE CREATIONS MAKE A LOVELY HOMEMADE GIFT.



So easy to make, just pop them in the microwave and tuck them in your coat pocket or mittens on a frosty day to keep your fingers warm. Add to this with an optional touch, a couple of drops of essential oils into the rice to keep your handwarmers smelling lovely.

Materials:

A bowl of white rice

A pencil

Paper

Festive Fabric - 100% cotton or felt

Scissors

Needle and thread

Pins



Tip -Try some different shapes and sizes. Microwave between 15 to 30 seconds depending on size.



Create your template using a piece of paper and a pencil, drawing the shape and size that you would like your handwarmer to be and cut this out.



Pin this template to your festive fabric and cut around. Do this twice to leave you with two identical sized and shaped pieces of fabric.



Pin these pieces of fabric together so that the desired pattern you wish to be on the outside is facing each other.



| Stitch together the pieces of fabric around the edges, leaving a gap big enough to fill the inside on one edge. The stitching should also leave ½ cm seam allowance.



105 Invert the pocket inside out. You may need to use the pencil to poke out the corners.



 $06^{\,\mathrm{You}}$ will be left with a pocket with a gap along one edge.



Make a cone out of a piece of paper to act as a funnel for your rice and fill the pocket ¾ full. Ensure the rice is white as brown rice can have an unpleasant smell.



O Stitch along the seam to close the pocket. If you'd like to present as a gift, why not repeat the process and tie the handwarmers together with some ribbon.

Did you know that in Scandinavian countries, the Christmas feast is traditionally enjoyed on Christmas Eve? It's a custom that seems some of us in Britain have taken up, which might perplex you at first but

if you look closer, you may discover it has its benefits. As the family head chef, have you ever felt a bit cooped up in the kitchen during Christmas day? Or missed that special moment when your little one opened a present they absolutely loved

while you were par-boiling the potatoes and chopping veg? Christmas day is filled with so many special moments and is a day for spending as much time with family as possible. With so much choice now in the shops from smoked salmon



with very little prep time, why not have a Christmas buffet during your day? It will mean spending less time in the kitchen cooking on the big day

or great aunt who you haven't seen for years. What's more, it will allow any guests to grab a bit here and there, especially if you happen to

or next? Or perhaps for you Christmas day itself just wouldn't be the same without the Christmas roast and that familiar bang of crackers.

Christmas Stollen

A TRADITIONAL BAKE WITH ALMONDS AND DELICIOUS MARZIPAN.

Where there's Christmas, there's Stollen. Beautifully fruity and an all-time classic. This wonderful creation is weaved with marzipan to give that extra sweet and nutty flavour. Bake over the weekend with lots of time to prove the dough and get the kids involved squidging the fruit into the mixture.



Ingredients

- 100g mixed dried fruit with peel
- 180ml apple juice
- 7g dried yeast
- 250g plain flour, plus a little extra for dusting
- 30g blanched whole almonds
- generous pinch of ground cinnamon

- generous pinch of ground aniseed
- small pinch of ground cloves
- 75g cold marzipan,
- 10g butter, melted
- 1 tbsp icing sugar

Method

- 1. Soak the dried fruit in 100ml of hot water. Gently warm the apple juice for a few mins in a pan, then add the yeast and leave to activate for 10-15 mins (it will start to bubble).
- 2. Put the flour in a bowl. Stir in the yeast and apple juice mixture to form a smooth dough, then cover and leave to prove somewhere warm until roughly doubled in size, about 1-2 hrs. You can also put the dough in the fridge to rise slowly overnight.
- **3.** Drain the fruit and add to the dough along with the nuts, spices and marzipan. Squish everything together, then turn the dough out onto a lightly floured work surface and knead until the fruit stays in the dough.
- **4.** Shape the dough into a sausage shape and put it on a baking tray lined with baking parchment. Cover with a clean tea towel and leave to prove somewhere warm for 30 mins to 1 hr until it has risen by about a quarter.
- **5.** Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Bake the stollen for 20 mins, then reduce oven to 150C/130C fan/gas 2 and bake for 25-30 mins more until golden brown and firm to the touch.
- **6.** Remove the stollen from the oven and brush all over with the melted butter. Dust with the icing sugar and leave to cool completely before slicing. Store any remaining stollen, well wrapped, in an airtight container.


