

## The Christmas Tree

EXPLORING THE ORIGINS AND SOME FUN FACTS ABOUT THE MUCH LOVED TRADITION.

Walking through the rows of evergreens, appraising each one for the perfect selection, before standing it proudly within the home adorned with beautiful decorations, marks the start of the festive period. A ritual continued each year by many, yet with our own unique memories from childhood.

Germany is often credited with starting the tradition in the 16th century, when devout Christians brought the trees into the home for decoration. However, some roots go back even further. The winter solstice was celebrated by the early Romans with a feast called the Saturnalia, in honour of Saturn, the god of agriculture. It marked the shortest day and the longest night was over, and soon the sun would return to the farms and orchards. As part of this celebration, the Romans would decorate their homes and temples with evergreen

branches traditionally known as boughs. The use of the evergreen to represent eternal life during winter was also used by the ancient Egyptians, Chinese and Hebrews. Christmas tree decorating in Britain was first started by the Royal family in the early 19th century, which descended into wealthier families in the 1840s. By the mid-1920s it was a familiar feature to many households in the UK.

Trafalgar Square in London hosts a 20 metre tall tree display, donated to the people of Britain every year by the city of Oslo in Norway ever since 1947. The tree is a token of gratitude for the British support to Norway during the Second World War.

So, if you celebrate Christmas with a fresh tree or an artificial one, enjoy gathering around it with your family this year, with perhaps a little more knowledge of when it all started and why.

Ensure you have a soft, fluffy pair of socks to pull out from your drawer.






# Perfectly Painted And Ready To Entertain

 $oxed{LVL}$  would truly transform the heart of their home. The key design element they requested was shaker style, painted with a colour that reflected the light and felt welcoming. Storage solutions that made the best use of all the space available was a must, in the design of their new fitted kitchen. ▷▷

#### THE DESIGN

Mr and Mrs Gregory were drawn towards Croft, a shaker style kitchen, with a painted finish and contemporary design.

Following from the brief to lighten up the space, the couple were advised on all the colour options available by expert designer Danny Simonsohn; and together they chose the perfect paint palette for their kitchen transformation. Pebble grey was selected as the colour to frame the cabinet doors. creating a unique contrast against the the kitchen fascias, to be painted in dove. Alabaster white was also used on the inset door frames of the glass units.

A breakfast bar incorporated in the design of the fitted kitchen, adds extra seating, perfect for dining on the go and more worktop space when preparing meals.

A tall set of cleverly designed cupboards along the far wall of the main





kitchen area, not previously used to its full potential, has been utilised perfectly in the design. Enclosed is a large tandem larder unit and discretely hidden fridge freezer.

Adding a touch of glamour to the room - a Quartz Strata worktop with a white mirror effect gives a luxurious feel to the kitchen redesign; perfect for entertaining, reflecting the light in the evening from overhead spotlights. A decadent 30mm worktop adds an extra depth of lux to the overall look of the kitchen.

presents in their trail.



With a clear passion for his role, and a cheerful persona complementing our head office team, we were excited to get to know more about our Product Manager, Lee Burridge. We uncover the roots behind the wealth of knowledge he holds, built

from 12 years of service at the company.

# What is a typical day in the life of a Product Manager at Hammonds Furniture?

Every day is quite varied, depending on the time of year and progress of any

projects. However a standard day may consist of producing and analysing stats based on the previous week's sales - this will be volume, value and breakdown of range and colours. This helps to see any shifts in trends and fashions, particularly if any range or finish is dropping in sales. Following this I may check some inspirational or competitor websites, to keep up to date with any offerings in terms of promotions or products they may have to ensure we don't miss anything. In addition, I work on the current project which may be a new range, colour or product we are creating.

# Why do you think it's important to have a Product Manager in a business?

It's important in order to stay up to date and move forward with the times.

There are so many competitors in the marketplace now that it is more difficult than ever to stand out and as such we need to be as current as possible. It's my job alongside others to

monitor the market for any up and coming trends and to identify any gaps in the marketplace that we can take advantage of. I also work to ensure that any changes to products or new releases are communicated and managed to completion.

Hammonds recently launched a new light grey tone, could you give us some more detail?

We have seen a massive move towards all shades of grey tones over the past couple of years - it's a lovely finish as it adds some warmth whilst remaining quite simple. It is a fantastic base to all styles and colours of décor. At the time of conception we only offered Harpsden in painted grey finishes, so offering it across 6 more of our ranges, makes it



accessible to all tastes, styles and budgets.

What sources of inspiration do you use to stay up to date with the trends of the industry?

Social media has been a great source of inspiration for both products and trends,

in particular sites such as Pinterest and Instagram. I also use blog sites such as Houzz and the monthly KBB (Kitchen, Bedrooms & Bathrooms) review magazine to keep up to date with the news on suppliers, competitors and the marketplace.




the sky. Breathe in the crisp air, filling your lungs and awakening your body. The


hovering wisps of fog that linger low along the clearings and perhaps take a picture




#### The Snow Child - Eowyn Ivey



# Vegan Noodles

CELEBRATE THE CHINESE NEW YEAR BY COOKING UP THIS DELICIOUS ORIENTAL DISH.

2018 will be the year of the Dog after the year of the Rooster for 2017. The Chinese zodiac symbol for Dog represents loyalty and honesty; the ancient zodiac says that people born in the year of the Dog possess these traits as well as being smart, friendly and have a strong sense of responsibility. To celebrate the Chinese New Year, we recommend this Vegan noodle recipe from Jamie Oliver. It's incredibly moreish and packs a punch of flavour.

### Ingredients:

200g thin rice noodles
300g mixed oriental mushrooms, such as
oyster, shitake and enoki, cleaned
2 cloves of garlic
1 fresh red chilli
1 thumb-sized piece of ginger
200g courgettes
½ bunch of fresh coriander
6 spring onions

groundnut oil, or vegetable oil

1 teaspoon cornflour

2 tablespoons low-salt soy sauce

1 tablespoon agave syrup

1 teaspoon sesame oil

½ tablespoon rice wine, or dry sherry

100g baby spinach

2 limes, to serve

sambal, or hot chilli sauce, to serve

#### Method

- 1. Cook the noodles according to packet instructions, drain well, rinse under cold running water, then set aside. Finely slice or tear the mushrooms, leaving any smaller ones whole. Peel the garlic and deseed the chilli, then finely slice. Peel the ginger and trim the courgettes, then slice both into matchsticks. Pick the coriander leaves and set aside, then finely slice the stalks. Trim and finely slice the spring onions, reserving the green part for later.
- 2. Heat a good lug of oil in a large wok over a high heat, then add the mushrooms and fry for 3 to 4 minutes, or until slightly softened. Add the chopped garlic, chilli, ginger, courgette, coriander stalks and the white part of the spring onions. Fry for a further 3 minutes, or until softened and lightly golden.
- **3.** Meanwhile, combine the cornflour and 2 tablespoons of water, then mix in the soy, agave syrup, sesame oil and rice wine or sherry. Stir the mixture into the pan and cook for a further 3 minutes, or until thickened.
- **4.** Roughly chop and add the spinach along with the noodles. Toss well to warm through, then tear in most of the coriander leaves. Serve with lime wedges, sambal or chilli sauce and the reserved coriander and spring onions scattered on top.
